## Thomas F. "Mack" McLarty, III

Thomas F. "Mack" McLarty, III (born June 14, 1946) has a distinguished record of business leadership and public service. Elected to the Arkansas state legislature at the age of 23, he served as chairman of the state Democratic Party from 1974-1976, and later served as finance chair for both David Pryor's and Bill Clinton's gubernatorial McLarty worked with President Jimmy Carter as a member of the Democratic National Committee and was appointed by President George H.W. Bush to the National Petroleum Council and the Council on Environmental Quality. He served President Bill Clinton as White House Chief of Staff, Counselor, and Special Envoy for the Americas, with over five years of service in the President's Cabinet and on the National Economic Council. As White House Chief of Staff, Mr. McLarty helped enact the historic 1993 deficit reduction package, the North American Free Trade Agreement, the Family and Medical Leave law, and the landmark welfare reform legislation. He is currently President of McLarty Associates, a strategic advisory firm based in Washington DC, and President of the McLarty Companies, a fourth generation family automotive business.
